

Conditions of Use: EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities

Adopted: 14th March 2009

1. **EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities** include all buildings, adjacent land and parking areas, and all building contents including the kitchen facilities, and all tools, equipment, etc.

EAA Chapter 292 Members, guests, and others using the EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities for any reason do so entirely at their own risk (*and they and their heirs and assigns agree to hold harmless the EAA, EAA Chapter 292, and any of their members or officers for any claim, loss or damages arising from any incident, accident or occurrence.*)

Any use of the facilities signifies agreement to this and the following provisions.

2. Use of EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities.

(a). EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities may be used for regularly scheduled or occasional functions approved by the Board or Membership, for example: Regular EAA meetings, regular OPA meetings, Young Eagles Activities, Fly-Ins, Coffee Klatch, Men's Pinochle, etc.

(b). EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities may be used by the members for personal building projects upon approval by the Board or Membership. Each Member assumes all responsibility and liability for their personal items/projects. At the discretion of the Board or Membership, members building personal projects may be assessed a monthly fee for use of the EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities.

(c). EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities may be used for occasional 'aviation community' related events upon approval by the Hangar Manager. Such use must be sponsored by an EAA Chapter 292 member who will assume responsibility for the activity. Examples of such events are: occasional meetings related to aviation or airpark topics; anniversary functions for EAA Chapter members; service club meetings where some aspect of aviation is the meeting topic, remembrance services or activities related to an EAA member or Airpark resident, etc. Where the Hangar Manager is unsure of the appropriateness of the activity, s/he shall refer the request to the Board for a decision.

(d). Except when the EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities are in use by an approved user, Chapter tools and equipment may be used in the Hangar at any time by members.

(e). All persons using the EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities are responsible for any damage to the Hangar, facilities, tools or equipment and shall leave the Hangar clean after use. The Board may assess any user a fee for cleaning or repair if the Hangar is not left in a satisfactory condition.

3. EAA Chapter 292 Hangar Facilities : Tools and Equipment.

(a). With the exception of Kitchen Facilities, non members of EAA Chapter 292 are specifically prohibited from using Chapter tools and equipment.

(b). Use by Members. It is the responsibility of each member to ensure that s/he assures himself or herself that the tools and/or equipment are appropriate for the task, are in good condition and safe to use, and that s/he uses proper procedures, appropriate protective equipment and recognized safety practices.
